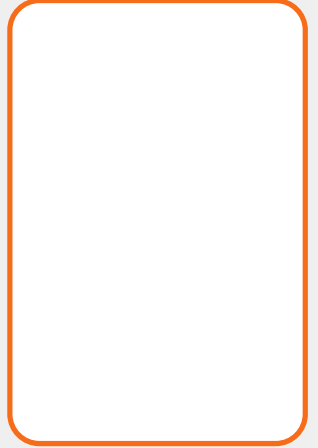

Significance of National Flag

National Flag

The National Flag is a horizontal tricolour of India saffron (kesaria) at the top, white in the middle and India green at the bottom in equal proportion. The ratio of width of the flag to its length is two to three. In the centre of the white band is a navy-blue wheel which represents the chakra.

The top saffron colour, indicates the strength and courage of the country. The white middle band indicates peace and truth with Dharma Chakra. The green shows the fertility, growth and auspiciousness of the land.



Its design is that of the wheel which appears on the abacus of the Sarnath Lion Capital of Ashoka. Its diameter approximates to the width of the white band and it has 24 spokes. The design of the National Flag was adopted by the Constituent Assembly of India on 22 July 1947.

- Flipped classrooms which include pre-class activities, followed by class, discussions, brain storming, problem solving, quizzing, project designing and enabling for the research.**

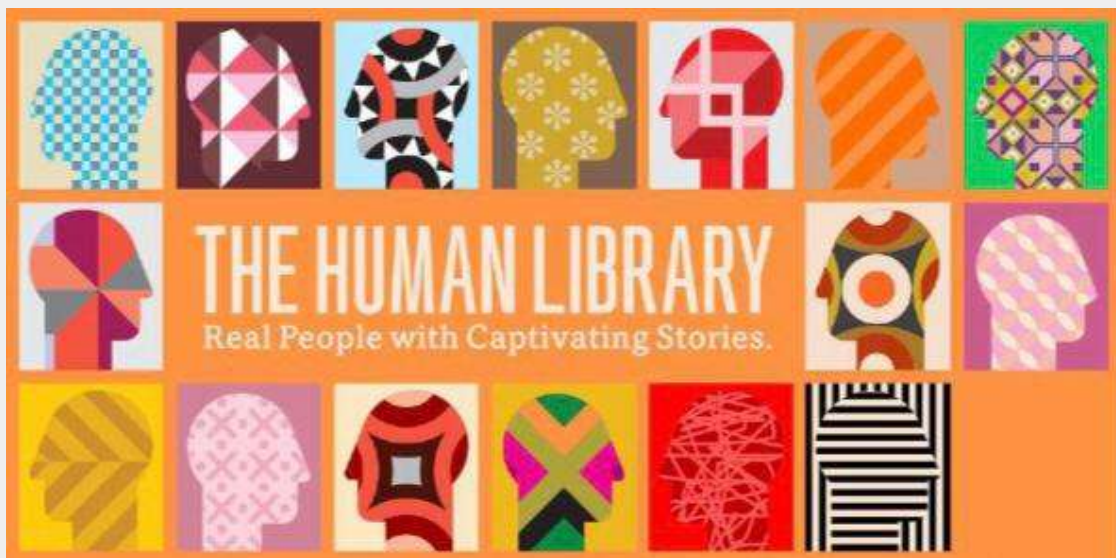


Human Library at SGGSPS Moga

Guidance and counselling cell

It is easier to build strong children, than to repair broken Adults

The aim of counselling cell is to help the students raise their self-esteem and confidence. It further makes them aware about their own emotions, abilities, aptitude and guides them to be mindful of their surroundings.

Activities and objectives:

Mentoring through individual counselling:

The children were able to discuss their problems, without the fear of being judged and then again in the confidence to resolve them and progress.

Guidance and growth through group counselling

Group counselling sessions are organised to address common issues of particular age group through brain storming and active discussions. They are usually able to find solutions to the issues on their own.

Organising workshops and seminars

Workshops and seminars are part of the curriculum of the school as it takes the children beyond the classroom education and send sensitizes them thus making them aware of the world around.



Rules of the school library

The students from classes pre primary to 12th can avail the facility of school library during school hours on all working days. A wide range of books related to different streams and subject matter are available in the library.

- Reference books are not issued. These books can be read only in the library.
- Complete silence should be maintained inside and in the vicinity of the library .
- strict discipline has to be maintained in the library as it is a silence zone .
- The students should not bring school bag in the library .
- Library books, magazines and furniture are the property of the school and must not be marked, damage or taken out of the library without permission .
- From class fourth onwards, the students can get books issued from the library .





School Transport Rules

A child's safety, while commuting in the school bus is our priority. The school buses are provided with speed, governors, cameras, and GPS.

The students can avail the school transport and are not allowed to come to school in a self driven two wheeler or four wheeler.

- All the students using the school bus are expected to be at the bus. Stop at least five minutes before the arrival of the bus.
- The bus will not wait for the late comers.
- Children should stay away from the main road, until the bus arrives.
- No student should come near the entry door of the bus, until it is completely her halted .
- Students will be held responsible for any damage done to the school buses due to their negligence and vandalism.
- Any misbehaviour on part of a student with the bus driver, conductor, bus teacher, or another student will be viewed as a grave mistake and may lead to suspension from the school.
- Parents are not allowed to enter the school bus under any circumstances, nor it is expected that they should get into an argument with the bus teacher, driver or conductor . Transport facility of the child may be suspended or even cancelled, if any such confrontation is reported.
- The drivers attention must not be distracted for any reason.
- Students are not allowed to sit in the parked buses during school hours.
- The bus teachers and student bus monitors are responsible for maintaining discipline in the bus .
- Discarding of trash or food either inside or outside the bus is not permitted.



General Instructions for Teachers

- To report for duty in time and to record the exact time of arrival and departure in Staff Attendance Register on every working day.
- To get the due sanction of the leave from the Principal before availing and also to observe the Leave Rules.
- To be present in the morning assembly ground at least five minutes before the assembly bell goes.
- To observe, instruct and help the students to maintain proper discipline and to participate actively in the morning assembly.
- To check the uniform of the students of the class and record the uniform defaulters regularly.
- To take the roll call of the students of the class and ensure that the same has been recorded in the attendance on Daily Attendance Register.
- To maintain the Student's Attendance Register properly. To submit them complete in all respects, to the Headmistress and Principal for checking along with the lists of uniform defaulters and absentees on the last working day of every month.
- To utilize first few minutes of the first period to instruct the students regarding uniform, performance in morning assembly, class discipline, maintenance of students' possessions, class –room furniture and school property, cleanliness of class-rooms, general manners, etiquettes and good habits.
- To intimate properly the detailed weekly timetable to the students and parents and the change (if any).
- To make a proper division of books/note books/work books and ask the students to bring them to the school as per instructions.
- To make a proper and regular use of the Student's Diary to assign home work and to communicate with the parents. To fill regularly the columns like-Home Work Not Done, Note Book Not Brought, Uniform Defaulters, Late Coming, Absentee Note etc.
- To prepare and display the class time-table and class information chart in the class room.
- To assign the home work regularly. To check and evaluate carefully and thoroughly all the class and home assignments. To put signatures with date after checking.
- To instruct the students, especially the monitors to maintain proper discipline in the class-rooms as well as in the school.
- To observe the conduct of every student and report to the Principal about naughty/mischievous/problems students.
- Not to leave the classes unattended in any case.
- To plan the teaching work in advance, consulting the syllabus and courses of studies meant for the class and teach the students as per guidelines and instructions issued there in and notified from time to time.
- To give due importance to Oral Work, Handwriting, Reading, pronunciation etc.
- To keep pace with the advancement in education and make a proper use of latest Teaching aids (Audio and Visual).
- To consult the Dean, Academics or the Principal if there is any difficulty or problem regarding syllabus.
- To submit the Teacher's Diary with weekly teaching plan to the Principal for checking in the First period of the first working day of every week.
- To enlist the difficulties concerning the coverage of the syllabi and record the necessary suggestions and recommendations for improvement.
- To submit all the documents (lists, papers, reports, results etc.) after thorough checking by the stipulated date & time.

One can gather all the details regarding school- academics, beyond academics, school vision, motto & mission, its infrastructure details, sports, extra curricular activities, teaching methodology, board results, admission procedure and also a quick view of photo gallery. One can also access the (Message Board) by logging in with the username and password. Once logged in, the students can download the assignments, homework and worksheets. Message Board is also used as a mode of Communication.

Parents can login with their username and password for updating their personal information like address, phone number and various details. They can also view the fee bill and pay online. They can further use it for sending any feedback or message to the school. They can view their child's report card too.

The school endeavours to be a paper free zone, consequently the hard copies of the circulars will not be given. The parents are requested to check the school website regularly to remain updated with all the current and latest information.



PROCEDURE FOR CHANGE IN NAME

Change in the name of a child is allowed only till the child is in Class VIII. For changing the name of a student in the school records, the following documents (in original) are required :

1. Affidavit from the Executive Magistrate (Not from the office of Notary), concerning the change in name.
2. Two newspapers (Hindi & English), where the concerned change of name has been published.
3. A copy of the State Govt. Gazette, where the change in name has been published.
4. One covering letter from the parent addressed to the Head of the School for the change in name of the Student.
5. However, if the child is in Class IX and above, the change in name is not encouraged and is subject to guidelines laid down by the PSEB.

Change/Correction in the date of birth is not allowed. The Birth Certificate submitted by the parent, during the admission of the child, is considered as the sole proof of the date of birth. Any request for alteration in the date of birth will therefore be considered as a forge, and thereby will never be entertained.

In case, a child is admitted in Class II or above, the date of birth mentioned on the Transfer Certificate of the child, issued from her/his previous school, is considered as the proof for the date of birth.

WITHDRAWAL

1. If a child has to be withdrawn from school, parents are requested to give one calendar month's notice in writing, failing which, one month's fee will be charged in lieu thereof.
2. If a child is withdrawn immediately after admission, a month's fee and month's proportionate annual charges are to be paid.
3. Those who leave the school in May, must in all cases pay the fee for the month of June.
4. Transfer certificate is not issued until all dues of the school are settled.
5. Students can be asked to leave the school on the following grounds:
 - a) Disciplinary - If the student is issued two warning letters he/she will be suspended for five days. A third warning letter would result in expulsion from the school.
 - b) Detention or repeated detentions in a class.
 - c) If the parent/child fails to deposit the fee for two consecutive quarters.



SCHOOL FACILITIES

Sggsp school , Jindrha provides its students with the latest as well as the most trusted learning tools and facilities.

SIGNIFICANCE OF OUR COUNTRY'S NAME

Bharat

Bharat = bha + rat; Bha = Dhyaprakash or light of knowledge; Rat = Ramanam or continuously perceiving knowledge. Bharat = A country continuously perceiving light of knowledge. The name Bharat used for the Republic of India, is derived from the name of King Bharata, the son of Dushyanta, a legendary ruler from the epic Mahabharata. The realm of Bharata is known as Bharatavarsha. The official Sanskrit name of the country is Bharata Ganarajya.

HINDUSTAN

Hindustan is a Persian word for "Land of the Indus". The name 'Hind' is derived from an Iranian pronunciation of Sind. The terms 'Hind' and 'Hindustan' were used in Persian and Arabic languages from 11th century, during the Islamic conquests. The rulers in the Sultanate and Mughal periods called their Indian dominion, centred around Delhi, Hindustan. 'Sthan' is a Persian suffix meaning 'home of/place of'. The term Hindustan entered the English language in the 17th century.

The term India is derived from River Indus, the valley around which, was the home of the early settlers. The Aryan worshippers referred to the river Indus as the Sindhu, the Sanskrit name of the Indus River. The ancient Greeks referred to the Indians as "Indoi", the people of the Indus.

INDIA

NATIONAL EMBLEM

Carved out of a single block of polished sandstone, the Capital is crowned by the Wheel of the Law (Dharma Chakra). The wheel appears in relief in the centre of the abacus with a bull on right and a horse on left and the outlines of other wheels on extreme right and left. The bell shaped lotus has been omitted.

The words Satyameva Jayate from Mundaka Upanishad meaning 'Truth Alone Triumphs', are inscribed below the abacus in Devanagari script.

The state emblem is an adaptation of the Sarnath Lion Capital of Ashoka. In the original, there are four lions, standing back to back. In the state emblem, adopted by the Government of India on 26th January 1950, only three lions are visible, the fourth being hidden from view. Mounted on an abacus with a frieze carrying sculptures in high relief of an elephant, a galloping horse, a bull and a lion separated by intervening wheels over a bell-shaped lotus.
